For beginners and those with experience. Held on Weekends

On a day class you are shown how to make a pot on the potter's wheel and spend the morning making thrown pots. After lunch you make a hand built pot which we show you how to decorate. 5 pieces of work are selected from your masterpieces, you choose your colours, and the pots are glazed and fired. You collect your work from the pottery at a later date.

Raku Days

Discover this ancient Japanese pottery technique.

Raku is an ancient Japanese firing technique dating back to 1580. Pots are glazed with a low temperature glaze (1000c). Wares are taken out of the kiln at top temperature and placed into a combustible material where it burns until cool. The glaze effect is revealed when the ashes are scrubbed from the cool pot. Each piece is unique.
